



## Prayer Partner

Matthew 18: 19,20 Authorized (King James) Version

19 Again I say unto you, that if two of you shall agree on earth as touching anything that they shall ask, it shall be done for them of my Father which is in heaven. 20 For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them.

The Greek word used for “agree” in this passage is *sumphónēó*: To agree, to be in harmony, to be of one mind. From Strong’s Exhaustive Concordance #4856, 4856 *symphōnéō* (from 4862 /*sýn*, “together with” and 5456 /*phōné*, “sound, voice,” which is the root of the English word, “symphony”) – properly, voicing the same opinion because like-minded.

### Prayer Partner suggested guidelines

- Have specific time to pray and make the commitment to show up- either on the phone or online.
- Set a time limit to pray. It goes without saying that without thinking, minutes can slip away.
- Establish the reason for your prayers and keep it focused.
- Make sure you take time to listen and let the other party have time to pray.
- Guard against being judgmental and not forgiving or taking on a grudge from partner.
- Be sure to value transparency, holding confidence, staying in humility and forgiveness.
- Partner should be knowledgeable about the Word of God and be willing to hear the Holy Spirit’s leading.
- Foster accountability to be able to speak to each other in love with fear of rejection.
- Pray partner should have empathy toward your family, especially the children.
